

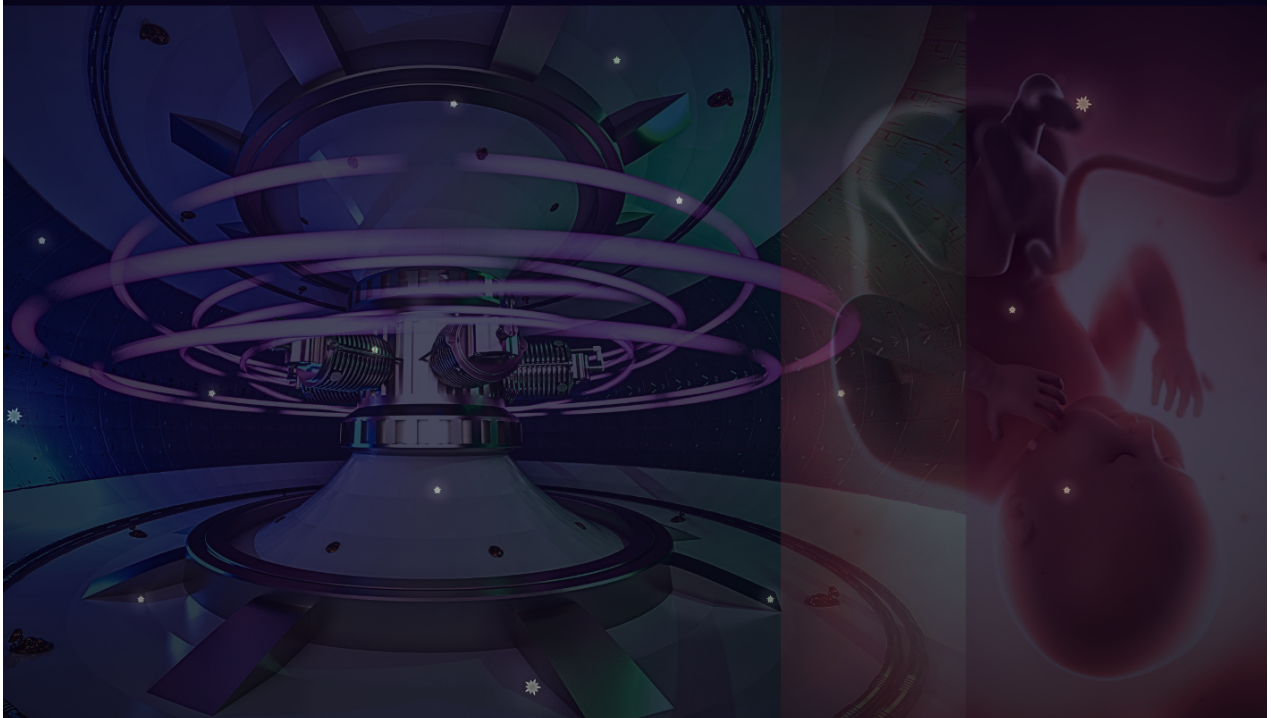

Why Most Planets Govern Two Signs

Most planets govern two signs because their function operates in two complementary modes.
